

**WASHINGTON PARISH POLICE JURY
ORDINANCE**

The following ordinance was offered by Michael Applewhite and duly seconded by Randy Strickland. A quorum being present and voting, Ordinance No. 98-202 was adopted at the Regular Meeting of the Washington Parish Police Jury on October 26, 1998.

ORDINANCE NO. 98-202

The Washington Parish Police Jury in regular session duly convened in keeping with the authority granted by applicable federal and state laws and regulations does hereby enact an ordinance to address the situation which arises in certain elections confined to specific wards, such as, but not necessarily limited to, Justice of the Peace, Constables, Fire Districts and specifically school board members in the Bogalusa/4th Ward School District.

BE IT ORDAINED, that where precinct lines transcend any ward lines in such elections as noted above, the Washington Parish Police Jury hereby directs any and all affected entities, specifically but not limited to, the Registrar of Voters, Clerk of Court and the affected school board(s), to effect a means by which all registered voters affected by such elections are provided the opportunity to cast their vote for the proper district election (i.e., Justice of the Peace, Constables, Fire District and School Board). This can be accomplished by using "lock-out" voting machines where applicable.

Precinct 7-3. All property contained within the corporate limits of the Village of Angie.

Precinct 8-1. Beginning at the intersection of the Louisiana/Mississippi State line and Mud Creek, thence southerly on Mud Creek to Hayes Creek, thence southerly on Hayes Creek to Parish Road

61 (Max Brumfield Road), then easterly on Parish Road 61 to Parish Road 62 (T.C. Brumfield Road), thence easterly on Parish Road 62 to Lawrence Creek, thence northerly on Lawrence Creek to State Highway 438, thence northerly on said highway to Parish Road 248 (Sam Thomas Road), thence northerly on said road to the Louisiana/Mississippi State line, thence westerly on state line to Mud Creek and the point of beginning.

Precinct 8-2. Commencing at the intersection of Louisiana Highway 38 and the Bogue Chitto River, continue north along the Bogue Chitto River to its intersection with the Louisiana-Mississippi State line; thence east along the Louisiana-Mississippi state line to its intersection with Hayes Creek; thence south along the meanderings of Hayes Creek to its intersection with Louisiana Highway 30 (La. Highway 38); west along La. Highway 38 to its intersection with the Bogue Chitto River and the point of beginning.

Precinct 8-2A. Commencing at the intersection of La. Highway 25 and La. Highway 38; thence easterly along La. Highway 38 to its intersection with the Otis Tate Road; thence south along the Otis Tate Road to its intersection with the Tob Wilson Road; thence south along the Tob Wilson Road to its intersection with Madison Bateman Road to its intersection with La. Highway 25, thence north on La. Highway 25 to its intersection with Louisiana 38 and the point of beginning.

Precinct 8-3. Beginning at the intersection of Parish Road 248 (Sam Thomas Road) and the Louisiana/Mississippi State line, thence southerly on Parish Road 248 to State Highway 438, thence southerly on said highway to Parish Road 47 (Woodrow Magee Road), thence southerly on Parish Road 47 to Parish Road 62 (T.C. Brumfield Road), thence easterly on Parish Road 62 to Parish Road 40 (James Creel Road), thence southerly on Parish Road 40 to State Highway 436, thence easterly on said highway to State Highway 62, thence northerly on State Highway 62 to State Highway 424, thence northerly on said highway to Parish Road 236 (D. C. Crain Road), thence northerly on said road to State Highway 438, thence northwesterly on said highway to Parish Road 238 (Perry Erwin Road), thence northeasterly on Parish Road 238 to a powerline, thence northerly on said powerline to the Louisiana/Mississippi State line, thence westerly on state line to Parish Road 248 (Sam Thomas Road), the point of beginning.

Precinct 9-1. Beginning at the intersection of the Tangipahoa/Washington Parish line and Little Silver Creek, thence easterly on Little Silver Creek to Sunny Hill Road, thence easterly on Sunny Hill Road to Silver Springs Creek, thence southeasterly on Silver Springs Creek to the Bogue Chitto River, thence southerly on said river to the corporate limits of the Town of Franklinton, thence southeasterly along corporate limits of Franklinton to State Highway 10, thence in a westerly direction on State Highway 10 to the Tangipahoa/Washington Parish line, thence northerly on parish line to Little Silver Creek, which is the point of beginning.



**WASHINGTON PARISH POLICE JURY
ORDINANCE**

The following ordinance was offered by Matthew Tate, and duly seconded by Randy Brumfield. A quorum being present and voting, Ordinance No. 98-203 was adopted at the Regular Meeting of the Washington Parish Police Jury held on October 26, 1998.

ORDINANCE NO. 98-203

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE THAT THERE SHALL BE SEVEN (7) COUNCIL MEMBERS, WHO SHALL EACH REPRESENT ONE OF THE SEVEN (7) CHARTER DISTRICTS AND TO ESTABLISH AND PROVIDE FOR THE GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF THE SEVEN (7) CHARTER DISTRICTS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Washington Parish Police Jury in regular session duly convened, as required by applicable federal and state laws and regulations, that it does hereby enact an Ordinance.

The Parish Council shall consist of seven (7) individuals qualified to hold the office, each of whom shall be domiciled in and elected by the voters residing in one of the seven (7) voting districts as herein provided.

The voting districts of Washington Parish shall be designated and shall contain the precincts indicated as follows:

DISTRICT	PRECINCTS
1	4-2A, 4-3, 4-3B, 4-7B, 4-10A, 4-10B and 4-11
2	4-5, 4-6, 4-7, 4-9, 4-9A, 4-10, 6-2, 6-4, and 6-4A
3	4-1, 4-2, 4-4, 4-5A, 4-5B, 4-8, 4-8A, 4-8AB and 4-8BB
4	4-1A, 4-8AA, 5-1, 5-1A, 5-3, 7-1A and 7-3
5	3-3C, 5-2, 5-2A, 5-2B, 7-1, 7-2, 8-1 and 8-3
6	3-1, 3-2, 3-3, 3-3A, 3-3B, 8-2 and 8-2A
7	1-1, 1-1A, 1-2, 2-1, 6-1, 6-3 and 9-1

The visible boundaries of the districts are hereby described as follows:
